## NCOA rolls out redesigned BLC

The Maneuver Support Center of Excellence Noncommissioned Officer Academy's Basic Leader Course has undergone a new design, which is scheduled to be fully implemented with the start of BLC Class 003-19 in January.

According to the NCO Leadership Center of Excellence, changes have been made to alleviate the "Death by PowerPoint" method of instruction, changing instead to having students learn by the Experiential Learning Method. The changes are being made at NCO academies across the Army.

The new course is built around the six leader competency areas, which are Communications, Leadership,

Operations (Army and Joint), Program Management, Readiness and Training Management. With the redesign, Soldiers will attend training six days a week. The 22-day course consists of 169 course facilitation hours, which are broken down as follows:

- Readiness, 37 hours**
- Leadership, 42 hours**
- Training Management, 22 hours**
- Operations, 14 hours**
- Communication, 47 hours**
- Program Management, 7 hours**

First Sgt. Michael McCabe, MSCoE Basic Leader Course first sergeant, said the focus has shifted to teach Soldiers to implement a plan, train and evaluate the training event.

"The new course has increased rigor in the content by adding written assessments and taking away the multiple choice exams," McCabe said. "Written assessments require more research, fostering creative and critical thinking skills while also teaching the NCOs proper use of time management."

McCabe said assessments in the new course content are based on demonstrated abilities and learning outcomes under the Experiential Learning Model, helping to enhance the Soldiers' ability to exercise practical applications once they return to their unit.

"The new course design is allowing BLC students the ability to

enhance their ability to think — not what to think," he said.

Sgt. 1st Class Brandon Washington, small group leader, agrees.

"That sense of ownership and responsibility, whether as a leader or as a learner, is incorporated from day one. The learner centric environment spurs curiosity that ignites a passion that allows the leader in

the learner to release," he said. "The changing world and enemy demands critical and creative thinkers to collaborate and solve problems, complete missions and develop leaders. Empowering Soldiers to think critically based on theoretical and doctrinal knowledge is powerful beyond means and that is what this course enables."

## Blended Retirement System opt-in deadline approaching

Soldiers eligible to opt-in to the Blended Retirement System have until Dec. 31 to decide whether to opt-in to BRS or remain with the legacy retirement system.

Active-duty service members with fewer than 12 years of service as of Dec. 31, 2017, and Reserve component service members with less than 4,320 points are eligible.

The BRS blends

the traditional legacy retirement pension, also known as a defined benefit, with a defined contribution benefit into a Thrift Savings Plan, or TSP.

This new system provides retirement savings benefits for the majority of service members, including those who serve fewer than 20 years.

## USO helps family rediscover military history

In October 2014, Kristen Davidson, a volunteer at the Fort Leonard Wood USO, received a phone call that led to an unexpected reunion.

"My sister and brother-in-law, Kelly and Peter St. Gelais, purchased a condominium in Dracut, Massachusetts. While going through the home, Pete came across the box of old military things and asked if we could do something with it," Davidson said. "We gladly took it hoping we could get it displayed."

After looking for relatives based on the information in the box and coming up empty, they

thought the Fort Leonard Wood USO may be their best chance at finding the rightful owner. Their thought was if no one could eventually be found, the USO would be a great place to display the items for future generations to see and learn from.

Kelly Brownfield, USO Western Missouri Regional Operations director, embarked on a four-year mission to return the service member's war relics.

Over the years, the USO tried to locate the owner of the box without any luck. "We have pulled the items out to see if we could find one more piece to the puzzle," Brownfield



said. "I thought; 'why not share it again on social media? Maybe we will have luck this time and find that one piece needed to complete this puzzle.'"

This time, luck was on Brownfield's side. Individuals from all over the world responded to her post resulting in a name and location within hours.

"We shared it, and our inbox started blowing up with possible leads," Brownfield said. "Within a couple hours, we had a name and location."

"I found it surreal

that the next day I was talking on the phone with family we spent four years in search of," Brownfield said. "Tears were shed, as they couldn't believe we continued the search for so many years to reunite them with so many items once belonging to their uncle, Lt. Col. Louie Brousseau," Brownfield said.

## Milley to be next top military advisor

On a frigid afternoon in Philadelphia, President Donald Trump stood with his next top military advisor prior to the annual Army-Navy football game.

Trump selected Gen. Mark Milley, chief of Staff of the Army, as the next chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. In a morning tweet preceding the annual Army-Navy

game, Trump tweeted his nomination of Milley.

"I am pleased to announce my nomination of four-star General Mark Milley, chief of Staff of the United States Army — as the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, replacing General Joe Dunford, who will be retiring," the president tweeted. "I am thankful to both of these incredible men for their

## Driving impaired affects lives

### Joplin police officer promotes sober driving

Officer Jared Swann of the Joplin Police Department works hard to keep impaired drivers off Missouri's roadways.

Not only is this his job, but it's his way of helping to prevent families like his own from suffering from an impaired driving crash.

Swann's brother was disabled in 1999, when a vehicle he was driving was hit by an impaired driver. A passenger in his brother's car was killed.

This holiday season the

Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety will be promoting Swann's story in statewide public-service announcements, reminding motorists of the consequences of driving impaired and reminding those who plan to celebrate to designate a sober driver or call a cab to avoid driving impaired.

Statewide, law enforcement will be on the lookout for impaired drivers; with targeted enforcement efforts beginning Friday through Jan. 1.

There were 53 people killed and 267 seriously injured in Missouri traffic crashes between December 10, 2017, and January 1, 2018. Eleven of the fatalities and 33 of the serious injuries involved a substance-impaired driver.

"We want everyone to enjoy a safe and happy holiday season," said Jon Nelson,

executive chair of the coalition. "So we are making a special effort to reach motorists with reminders to plan ahead for a safe and sober ride home."

What's tragic about these crashes is that they are clearly preventable. Impaired driving is a crime, not an "accident," and is one of America's most often committed and deadliest crimes. There are no excuses to drive impaired.

The facts are known — drinking and driving can be a lethal combination. The consequences are fines, jail time or even death. Enforcement will be out in full force this holiday season. If you choose to drive impaired, you will be arrested.

**Green: Proceed with normal operations.**

**Amber: Difficult to hazardous road conditions. Drivers must slow to 10 miles per hour below the posted speed limit.**

**Red: Hazardous road conditions, watch for black ice or ice sheeting. Speed limit is 10 to 15 MPH regardless of posted limit.**

**Black: Emergency vehicles are unrestricted. Non-emergency vehicles must obtain approval from their authorized delegated officer before traveling on the installation.**

# Vaccination is the best defense against the flu

The recent Influenza Awareness Week, Dec. 2 through 8 educated military personnel about the potential impacts of influenza on the Department of Defense mission and Force Health Protection Readiness.

Army Col. Tammy Mayer, consultant for Army Public Health Nursing and Health Promotion for the U.S. Army Surgeon General said, "The more that the community knows about flu prevention the better. Stopping the spread of influenza allows us to stay healthy and avoid missing school or work. We are fortunate to have a vaccine to help us in the fight against this (illness)."

Vaccination is the primary method for preventing influenza and its complications and getting an annual influenza vaccine is the best way to protect yourself and your family from the flu.

Vaccination is needed every year because the Influenza viruses change every few years, and scientists continue to monitor which viruses are circulating and change the ingredients in influenza vaccines to match them.

How well the influenza vaccine works (or its ability to prevent influenza illness) can range widely from season to season. The vaccine's effectiveness also can vary depending on who is being vaccinated.

Vaccination is the primary method for preventing influenza and its complications. Getting an annual influenza vaccine is the best way to protect yourself and your family from the flu.

The two main factors in the effectiveness of the vaccine is the health of the patient and the match between the influenza viruses that the influenza vaccine is designed to protect against and the influenza viruses spreading in the community.

"Each year, the flu vaccine must be reformulated to ensure it is effective. It's a complex process and can take several months to research and then manufacture the vaccine. Currently there is research underway to develop

a universal flu vaccine that provides improved protection against more subtypes of the virus. It may also eliminate the need to get a flu shot every year. There is also ongoing research to reduce the time to manufacture and develop the vaccine from months to weeks," said Mayer.

"The Army takes flu prevention seriously because of the potential impact of an outbreak on individual and unit readiness. The vaccine is mandatory for service members and strongly encouraged

for all other beneficiaries. Most people can recover from the flu by staying home and resting. This also helps to stop the spread of flu" said Mayer.

Patients without access to a military treatment facility can get the influenza vaccine from a participating retail network pharmacy or their health care provider.

Annual influenza vaccination is mandatory for civilian health care personnel who provide direct patient care and highly recommended for all other hospital employees

who work in DoD facilities.

Pregnant women are at an increased risk for severe illness and complications if infected with the influenza virus. The Centers for Disease Control recommends that pregnant women with continued concerns or questions about the influenza vaccination should discuss these with their health care provider in order to make an informed decision regarding vaccination.

For those who feel the vaccine may make them sick, Mayer recommends understanding their concerns.

"Everyone who presents for a flu shot will be screened to make sure it's safe for them to receive the vaccine. I try to help people understand the science behind vaccine development and how the body develops immunity. I also share that there are many other precautions in stopping the spread of the flu and other illnesses, including good washing, cough etiquette, and staying home when you are sick," said Mayer.

Like any medication, vaccines can cause side effects. The most common side effects are mild and resolve on their own within 24 to 48 hours. More serious adverse events are rare. Some children should not get certain vaccines for medical reasons, while others should receive more vaccines due to high-risk medical conditions.

service to our Country."

If confirmed by the Senate, Milley would succeed Marine Corps Gen. Joe Dunford, who has served in the position since September 2015. Dunford will step down in September 2019. Trump said the date of transition is "to be determined." Milley would be the 20th man to hold the position since General of the Army Omar Bradley in 1949.

Milley flanked Trump at mid-field as the president officiated the coin toss prior to the Army-Navy rivalry game held at Lincoln Financial Field Saturday. Milley, a Massachusetts native and Princeton graduate, has served as the Army's 39th chief of staff since 2015. Previously, he commanded U.S. Army Forces command at Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

He served as commanding general of III Corps, based at Fort Hood, Texas, and earlier as commander of the 10th Mountain Division.

According to Brousseau's nephew, Jay Brousseau, Louie lived his entire life in and around Lowell, Massachusetts, with his wife and daughter. He served a long stint in the Army National Guard and worked in a local printing press shop until he was in his late sixties.

After the death of Brousseau's daughter, his possessions were donated to a local charity. The family had assumed any records were destroyed.

"We moved on in our disappointment and had no idea any of the effects of our Uncle Louie and Aunt Dora had survived until Gail received a note on Facebook from

the good folks at the Missouri USO," Jay said.

He took the box to the family's Thanksgiving gathering in Pearl and, Texas.

"After dinner, we pulled the contents of the box out and slowly examined the wonderful black and white prints, records and uniform decor and medals," Jay said. "It was a very complete record of Louie's military service, and we were surprised to find that he was awarded the Bronze Star for actions in World War II."

One of the pieces that grabbed the family's attention was Brousseau's artillery company flag.

"We hope to find a suitable home for his flag with his old company, the 102nd Artillery Company, and donate any of the records

and photos they might find useful for their archives and/or museum after we've made some digital copies," he said.

The Brousseau family said they are grateful to the Missouri USO for working so diligently to find them and the opportunity they were given to know and understand their uncle's life and service.

"We are really thrilled to have had the chance to learn more about Louie and his military service, and we are extremely thankful to the incredible and persistent efforts of folks at Missouri USO," Jay said.

Davidson said she is thankful for Brownfield's efforts in finding the family.

"We were all surprised and thrilled when Kelly

## One chaplain's faith and duty

### To serve those who serve, where others fear to go

Born, raised and educated in Romania, Chaplain (Cpt.) George Oanca, pronounced Wonka, currently serves as a religious support officer for the 2nd Battalion, 10th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Chemical Brigade here on Fort Leonard Wood. But how he found himself here is no average tale.

"It is a long story, but I'll try to make it short," he said humbly with a subtle accent.

Although Romania is a secular state, a clear majority of the population identify themselves as Eastern Orthodox Christians. It is this faith that guides Oanca every day, through good times and bad.

"I was 19 years old when the revolution came in Romania," he said. "I remember that it was December, and I was in my third year in the seminary. I was caroling, and when the revolution

started, we were so happy."

"We heard about freedom and about democracy," he said. "We were thinking we are blessed because now we can experience that."

In the years following the 1989 revolution, "everything was good," Oanca said.

He married his wife in 1992 and they had their first child in June of the following year. "In 1993, I got my first parish as an orthodox priest," he said.

Oanca dedicated six years to building this church from the ground up in Ibriuanu, a farming village of about 350 families. "Wonderful people," he said fondly. "Good memories."

But life has its twists and turns, not all of them happy or productive.

"Our second child was born in October 1997," he said. "Unfortunately, the little angel came with a broken wing."

Oanca's daughter, Elizabetha, was born with VATER syndrome, a collection of birth defects affecting the esophagus, kidneys and vertebrae.

It currently has no known cause. "It couldn't be fixed (in Romania)," he said. "So, with the generosity and help of the people from the United States, we came here."

In September 1999, Dr. W. Hardy Hendon of the Boston Children's Hospital offered to perform the surgeries that would save Elizabetha's life.

Following her recovery, "we decided to immigrate to the United States," Oanca said. "The Romanian Episcopate sent me to Las Vegas on my first assignment as a parish priest."

This parish was a little different, he said. Families struggled, and came and left through the revolving door of gambling addiction. But the experience in Ibriuanu fortified him for his new assignment, he said, so "it was easy for me to adapt and start a ministry there."

Less than two years later, a crisis appeared again – and he answered.

"I saw what happened with the twin towers," he said. "The war started, and I saw the Soldiers going into combat."

"I thought, 'now it's time to pay back what this country gave me - how it saved my daughter's life,'" he said.

Oanca walked into an Army recruitment office, told the sergeant his story, and joined. "I want to serve those who serve, where others fear to go," he said.

Upon completing the Army Chaplain Center and School program, he was assigned to the 367th Engineer Battalion in St. Cloud, Minnesota.

"By March 7, 2010, my boots were on the ground in Iraq," he said. "It was quite a different ministry."

"I think when you are in a combat zone, your faith is tested every moment, going on patrol, going outside the wires, and knowing that you have to face the enemy," he said.

Although chaplains are defined by the Law of Armed Conflict as non-combatants, that did not mean Oanca was detached.

"I slept where they slept, in the tents, on the cots, on the ground," he said. "Doesn't matter if it was raining outside, if it was snowing, if it was muddy, I was with them."

Through this bonding with fellow service members, he learned and formed a message he hopes can help Soldiers coping with deployment stress today. "The biggest enemy

out there is not the bullet or the RPG, or the enemy that wants to kill you, to destroy you," he said. "The biggest enemy is the separation that we have to endure during the deployment."

That is why "the ministry of presence," a principle he was taught in training, is so important. "(Chaplains') presence brings a lot of moral courage and support for the Soldiers," he said.

To any service member looking to talk, "it doesn't matter when - I am available 24/7," he emphasized.

Oanca has had his own struggles after returning. "I found myself putting the uniform on after I came back," he said. "My wife would look at me and say, 'You are in the Reserves. You are a priest, back at church.'"

"My family is back in Colorado Springs. I miss them," he said, having not lived with them for four years. "But I am grateful at the same time, because they support me and understand the sacrifices that we, as parents, make."

Elizabetha, whose life led Oanca to join the Army in the first place, is now 21 years old, studying biochemistry, and plans to attend medical school to become a doctor.

"She wants to give back to the people that are suffering or in need of help," he said.

"The United States is my adopted mother," he continued. "I would like to express my gratitude to all the wonderful people I've met since I came here."

The family still visits Romania every other year.



# Army beats Navy 28-0

**Flag-football teams compete in annual game**

The Army flag-football team continued its winning tradition Saturday, beating the Navy 28-0 at Gerlach Field. "It was hard fought on both sides," said Army quarterback Deangelo Stevenson, who threw for two touchdowns, rushed for one and added four extra points on 2-point conversion plays. "It was definitely a spectator's event — we were going all-out, 100 miles an hour, the whole time."

Largely made up of players from this year's 554th Engineer Battalion team — which won the Commander's Cup Flag Football Tournament Oct. 18 — the Army team had been preparing since that time for the annual contest with the Navy.

"We've developed a chemistry that is very, very helpful with how we execute our game plan," said Army wide receiver Jeff O'Loughlin, who scored the final touchdown of the game on a 10-yard pass from Stevenson. "It's very advantageous for us."

The Navy team was made up of nine Navy Detachment players and six players from the U.S. Marine Corps Detachment.

The Army team wasted little time scoring in the first half. After earning two first downs on the opening series of the game, Stevenson threw a 15-yard pass to Demetrius Smedley in the end zone. Stevenson then ran in the 2-point conversion to take an early 8-0 lead.

Navy quarterback Connor Prentiss marched the team down to the 5-yard line on a series of short passes, but

couldn't get past the Army secondary. On a fourth-down and 5 play, Army cornerback Steven Sloan batted down a

pass intended for Navy receiver Joseph Houser to turn the ball over on downs. It wasn't long, however, before

the Navy had the ball back in its possession, with its secondary breaking up back-to-back passing attempts, and a sack by Houser

stalling the Army's advance at the 30-yard line.

But the Navy offense also had trouble gaining momentum, stymied by a sack by Army defender Rodriguez Mizell and passes batted down by Emmanuel Eleby. An interception by Stevenson gave the Army the ball back at its own 35-yard line.

The Army team slogged forward on runs by Stevenson, and a pass to Waddell Tollison to the 21-yard line. From there, on a third-down play, Stevenson made a lateral pitch to Lionel Hunter, who ran the ball in from the 20-yard line for the second touchdown of the game. Stevenson then ran in the 2-point conversion to give the Army a 16-0 lead as the first half drew to a close.

In the second half, the Navy nearly scored twice, once on an interception by Navy defender Matt Meske and another on a pass from Prentiss to Patrick Longoria, but both plays were nixed by personal fouls.

Steven scored again midway through the half, when, scrambling out of the pocket around the 30-yard line, he found a clear path to the end zone and ran more than 45 yards for a touchdown. The Navy defense deflected the 2-point conversion attempt, but the Army still held a 22-point lead.

The pass from Stevenson to O'Loughlin extended the Army's lead a few minutes later, leaving the Navy with less than a minute of game time remaining.

"I just tried to seize the opportunity and take advantage of what they gave me. To be able to score and go on to win the game was just icing on the cake," O'Loughlin said.

However, on the first play following the kick-off to the Navy, Army defender Ricardo Spriggs intercepted a pass to give the Army the ball with 28 seconds remaining.

After running one play to burn the Navy's last time out, Stevenson ran out the clock.

Col. Eric Towns, U.S. Army Garrison Fort Leonard Wood commander, presented his coin to Stevenson, naming him the MVP of the game.

Stevenson credited his teammates for the victory. "It was definitely a team win, for sure," Stevenson said. "I mean you can see where the team play came in, because as soon as I would get a little winded, our other quarterback (Hunter) would come in and pick right up where I left off."

Towns then presented the traveling championship plaque to the Army team.

Glen Banks, Army coach, said he was proud of his players, who "just came out and did what (they) normally do."

"We did really well," he said. "We have pretty much the same team we had from the intramural league, so we all knew each other."

### 14th MP Bde. presented with award

Earlier, during halftime, Towns and William Wasil, Fort Leonard Wood's new director of Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation, presented the 2018 Intramural Championship Trophy to the 14th Military Police Brigade. 

## Plugged-up catalytic converter unlikely to cause permanent damage

### Dear Car Talk:

I have a 2012 Ford Fiesta five-speed. The check engine light is on, and the computers at AutoZone and Big O say it's the catalytic converter and oxygen sensors. This will cost me about \$850 to fix. I'm pretty middle class. Since I'd rather buy lottery tickets with my money, can I just have a guy take out the catalytic converter and put in a straight pipe? We don't have emissions testing where I live, in Indiana. Please tell me how dangerous it is to drive with a "bad" catalytic converter. Will it destroy my engine? Will fumes back up into my front seat and make me drive into opposing traffic? Thanks. -- Marlyce

A 2012 Ford Fiesta ... you lucky devil! Here's the good news, Marlyce: Driving with a plugged-up catalytic converter shouldn't permanently harm your car.

At some point, if the converter gets completely plugged up, it'll diminish your power. And eventually it'll prevent the car from running at all. It'd be like having a potato in your tailpipe. Then you'll have to remove the converter if you want the car to run again.

As long as the exhaust system is intact, without leaks, you won't get any fumes in the passenger compartment. Of course, the same can't be said for the poor jamokes who are driving behind you.

The bad news, Marlyce, is that it's illegal to remove your catalytic converter. Federal law sets baseline emissions requirements for all cars in the United States, and gasoline-powered cars can't meet those emissions requirements without catalytic converters.

States are welcome to set emissions limits that are more strict than federal law, but not less strict. So you would be a criminal, even in Indiana, Marlyce. On the plus side, stripes can be slimming!

Now, in reality, since Indiana does not require emissions testing, it's unclear to me how you would ever get caught. But you'd still have to wrestle with something known as your conscience.

So it's your choice. You could save \$850 but increase the chances that you, your kids and your neighbors will get asthma, brain tumors and mutated DNA. Or you could spend the \$850, sleep well at night, but wake up every morning and wish you had an extra \$850.

Actually, you don't say how many miles are on your Fiesta. But emissions components -- including catalytic converters and oxygen sensors -- are all warranted for eight years or 80,000 miles. So if you've got 79,999 miles on the odometer, have it flat-bedded to the dealer and get that stuff replaced for free. If you're out of warranty, I can't tell you what to do, Marlyce. But if I could, I'd tell you to be a good citizen and replace the converter.


