CG'S CORNER

My question concerns the mandatory wearing of covers inside a privately owned vehicle. This is an annoyance and enlisted Marines do not salute while driving a vehicle. It would also be simpler and safer for officers to just acknowledge a salute rather than having to return

a salute from a vehicle. Would it be possible to make wearing a cover inside a privately owned vehicle an option aboard Camp Lejeune?

Your letter concerning the wear of a service cap is acknowledged and your concern is appreciated. Although I have certain latitude in designating how the uniform may worn by Marines in the Camp Lejeune area, you must understand both Navy and Marine Corps uniform regulations prescribe just how far those freedoms may be carried. In this case, both Navy and Marine regulations require the cover to be worn in a vehicle on military installation unless impractical or hazardous. Although to some, wearing the service cap in a vehicle may be uncomfortable or annoying, that is no basis for me to consider changing the base regulations.

Additionally, I have found no instances on record where an accident was directly attributed to an officer returning a salute while operating a vehicle. Therefore, I must deny your request to consider it an individual's option to remain uncovered while in a vehicle. Your initiative and continued interest in our standards of dress are most welcomed.

Harold White says he has seen many changes in Jacksonville and can still remember when Lejeune Boulevard was a dirt road.




Secretary of the Navy sends his farewell after six years





MAB completes Cold Winter '87

Combatants from Camp Lejeune recently returned from extensive cold-weather training in Norway, where they participated in NATO Exercise Cold Winter-87.

The 4th Marine Amphibious Brigade joined with the 6th Division, Norwegian Army March 20-25 for the bi-annual winter field exercise, scheduled by the Commander, Allied Forces North Norway, and conducted by the Commander, 5th Division for Brigade North and other Norwegian training units.

During the exercise, 4th MAB, augmented by the British 1st Para Battalion, Norwegian 3rd Battalion, Brigade North and other Norwegian home guard units, were opposed by the British and Dutch Marines, the United Kingdom and Netherlands landing Force, and the 1st and 2nd Battalions of Brigade North.

For the first time during a winter exercise in northern Norway, the Commanding General of 4th MAB, Brig. Gen. Matthew P. Caulfield, commanded the south forces with operational control of allied units.

Fourth MAB was comprised of the Command Element, Headquarters 4th MAB, Naval Amphibious Base, Little Creek Norfolk, Va., and the Aviation Combat Element of Marine Aircraft Group-14 (Forward), Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point, N.C. The other elements were the Ground Combat Element, Regimental Landing Team-2 and the Combat Service Support Element, Brigade Service Support Group-4, both from Camp Lejeune.

Arctic skills training began in early January for the Marines of RLT-2, with 30 days of a Battalion Operations Course at the Mountain Warfare Training Center, Bridgeport, California.

From there the RLT went to Fort McCoy, Wis., to participate in the Alpine Warrior-87 field training exercise, March 6-8. This training was designed to mirror the scenario of the Norwegian exercise, and was where many 4th MAB Marines received initial Arctic skills.

Throughout the related training, the focus remained on increasing individual combat proficiency, particularly in a hostile cold-weather environment, of the U.S. Marine Corps' most formidable weapon—the individual Marine rifleman.

The experiences of two such Marines exemplified those of virtually all participants in the training, designed to assure combat victory in any cold-weather environment.

A native of Rhode Island, Lance Cpl. Christopher J. Maderia was no stranger to freezing winters, but his experiences as a civilian did not prepare him for the lessons he learned at Bridgeport. Maderia was with Headquarters and Service Company, 3rd Battalion, 4th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division.

"It's a matter of survival; surviving to accomplish a combat mission in spite of the environment," said Maderia. "A casualty is still a casualty, and it doesn't matter if it's caused by enemy fire or frostbite."

To avoid becoming casualties, the Marines learned how to take care of themselves. Physical well-being translates directly to fighting ability, a matter of life or death and mission accomplishment.

The Marines also learned how to protect equipment against the cold.

"We kept a very thin coating of lubricant on our weapons and kept them under guard outside of our tents," explained Maderia. "If the weapons were warm

from being inside, then taken outside, condensation would form and freeze, possibly jamming the weapons."

Another Marine who learned the lessons only severe cold weather can teach was Lance Cpl. William V. Hatch, a machine gun-team-leader of 3rd Squad, Kilo company, 3rd Battalion, 2nd Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division.

"Simply moving from one place to another can be cumbersome and fatiguing," said Hatch, who grew up in Southern California. "Our M-60 machine gun weighs almost 20 pounds. Add another 10 pounds for ammunition and 40-50 pounds of field gear, then climb some mountains with skis and snow shoes, and you'll see what I mean."

Hatch's team did make it to the top of mountains during the training, and back again over the snow and ice through sub-freezing temperatures.

Perhaps there lies the most important learning experience for an individual participant in NATO Exercise Cold Winter-87—the proof from personal experience that an individual can in fact accomplish the mission, despite a harsh cold weather environment.

CSSD Marines work to keep operation rolling

RAUDSKJER, Norway—Like a 24-hour emergency road service, Combat Service Support Detachment (CSSD)-22's mobile repair Contact Teams were only a phone call away from helping stranded Marines during the 4th Marine Amphibious Brigade operation Cold Winter-87.

Because of the freezing temperature of Norway, Marines stranded in a vehicle on the road are more than inconvenienced. It actually becomes a matter of survival.

According to Gunnery Sgt. Oscar Olipane, CSSD-22 maintenance management chief, their whole purpose was to provide emergency services.

"If anyone needed emergency vehicle repair or a Contact Team, that request came through me first," he explained. "I was the middle man. Then I passed the information on to the appropriate section. After briefing them on the situation and type of equipment needed, we took immediate action on it."

Three sections shared the load, working around the clock to keep the operation rolling.

Engineer Support provided repairs for all generators, forklifts and derricks (backhoes). Ordnance provided teams for tanks, Light Armored Vehicles and amphibious assault vehicles, while Motor Transport provided wreckers for towing vehicles back when necessary.

"We tried to get as much information as possible so we can carry the parts necessary for repair with us," said Gunnery Sgt. James Maney, who oversaw all maintenance. "Usually, instead of having to drag the vehicle back with us, we could fix it at the site."

After receiving a call, a Contact Team was alerted to standby.

The job was still done, although they often worked without many of the necessary tools.

"It was extremely difficult for them working in the cold," said Maney, referring to the 15-degree Farenheit temperature. "It takes more time because it's harder to concentrate and they have to warm themselves often. Working on metal, almost nothing prevents fingers from freezing."

"These guys do a hell of a good job. They're a good group of Marines," added Maney.

Matthews and his team received the word that the transmission they were waiting on had arrived. After removing the whole 'power pack', the engine and transmission, they were ready to make the replacement.

"I've actually pulled a whole 'pack' by myself before in a couple of hours," said Matthews.

Running into problems, it took the team almost six hours. Even though, they still had the 'amtrac' ready by the time they promised.

"They gave us very good support," said Gunnery Sgt. William Lowery, AAVBn. Det. maintenance chief.

About eight hours later, the crew of the assault vehicle reloaded their gear and headed back to their unit. For the Contact Team, it was another long but productive night.

Sending another satisfied customer back to their unit, Matthews and his team proved again that nothing rolls continuously without good maintenance.

BMX bikes provide safe recreation for riders

As summer vacation approaches for school children, many parents are wondering what they can do to make the most of those three months in the way of family outings and entertainment.

One Berkeley Manor family has been working hard on a plan that may interest other families who have children who ride BMX bikes.

Sgt. William Washington, Air Delivery Platoon, LSB, FSSG, and his wife, Victoria, decided to do more than listen sympathetically when their children complained of "not much to do" after their move here from California last June.

When their 12-year-old son, Billy, wanted to continue motocross, organized bike racing, his parents assisted in every way possible, including taking weekend trips to Raleigh and Fayetteville to the two closest trails.

Billy recently placed third in the novice expert division in a Capitol City BMX motocross event in Raleigh. He also took fourth in a two-day race against 500 racers that qualifies him for state championships in Fayetteville, May 2.

"Our son has been racing BMX bikes for two years and has won several races. It's an exciting sport and much safer than people usually think," said Victoria.

The riders must wear helmets and elbow and knee pads to race, and the bikes are also padded.

While the outings away from Jacksonville are enjoyable for the whole family, the Washingtons hope to get a trail started in this area soon, for both their family and other interested Jacksonville residents.

"There is a small non-competition bike trail at Northeast Creek Park in Jacksonville, but it doesn't meet the correct specifications for racing," said Victoria.

"I have spoken with the Mayor and the director of the Jacksonville Recreation and Parks Department and they are very willing to assist in getting a better trail started," she said.

"We will try to upgrade the current trail as soon as we get the correct specifications," said David Lynch, athletic director for the city Recreation and Parks Dept. "Once we find out the degree of interest of local and military residents we will act. Right now we are in the preliminary stages of planning."

"We are looking for racers who are interested in competitive racing and families who are interested in getting the local trail organized," said Victoria. "This is one way the entire family can enjoy the summer together and meet others with the same interests."

"All each racer really needs is a 20 inch BMX bike and proper safety gear. It's a great way to keep children busy and happy," she said.







Refuelers get 'pumped up' for 24th MAU

Dust billowed from the rotor wash of the giant CH-53E helicopter, enveloping the landing zone. The rear hatch dropped and Marines emerged rolling hoses out and preparing them to be coupled to pumps.

The men, from Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-263, stationed at Marine Corps Air Station, New River were setting up and employing a Forward Arming and Refueling Point.

"A FARP is employed in a tactical situation for refueling aircraft," said Sgt. Richard Kellie, HMM-263, site noncommissioned officer-in-charge. "With the FARP in place, we can support all types of aircraft, allowing them to be closer to the area of operation and supporting the ground combat element."

"We can support a large number of aircraft right from the CH-53," said Cpl. Richard Brandon, a native of Johnstown, Pa. "We carry the fuel in rubber bladders inside the 'bird' and then just run hoses out from there to the refueling point."

During this operation the squadron refueled six CH-46 helicopters for the 24th MAU. HMM-263 is the air combat element for the MAU. With all the people having individually assigned tasks and doing them quickly, the portable gas station doesn't take long to be put into operation.

"From the time the fueling helicopter is grounded and we have gas delivered at the nozzle is less than 15 minutes," said Cpl. Kevin Burns, a New Haven, Conn. native. "In a combat environment, this

could prove invaluable to the ground troops who depend on air support."

"Ground troops also support the FARP by providing security," said Lance Corporal Robert Cooper, a Lake Cormorant, Miss. native. "We work together as a team to accomplish the mission."

This teamwork was demonstrated during this operation as the air and ground combat elements of the MAU rehearsed for a long range raid as part of its predeployment training. As the Marines scurried about setting up the pumps and hoses, Marines from Helicopter Support Team, MSSG-24, began positioning themselves to guide the helos in.

As the wheels of the CH-46's touched ground, Marines from 1st Battalion, 2nd Marines charged from them and deployed in a 360-degree-security perimeter. Using two nozzles, the support Marines fed each of the thirsty helicopters 120 gallons of JP-5 fuel. This took less than 25 minutes. Not only was the operation completed quickly, it also demonstrated the flexibility that is a common requirement in Marine Corps operations.

"We'd refueled the last scheduled helicopter in the operation," said Burns. "There was a Cobra still in the area that needed some fuel. He'd seen us as we worked and when we were done, he asked for gas. We fueled him and sent him on his way."

With all the helicopters fueled successfully, the security force back aboard and the mission completed, the Marines rolled up their hoses, closed the hatches and left in a cloud of dust.





Bad habits can lead to weight training injuries

Weight training has become a popular form of conditioning for both men and women. Without proper instruction, however, you can damage your muscles, bones and joints.

Overtraining. Train hard or long, but not hard and long. Don't train more than four days a week, or more than one hour per session.

Lack of Intensity. Complete repetitions until it is impossible to move that muscle...then stop.

Sloppy performance. Slow, steady movements get results. Don't race through repetitions or jerk when lifting.

Poor Warm-up. Muscles must be warmed up by doing a couple of sets of an exercise using lighter-than-normal weights.



Neglecting Muscles. Don't favor one or two muscle groups and exclude others. Train every part of the body with equal intensity to avoid muscle imbalances.

Lifting weights that are too heavy. Know your limit. If you are planning to lift heavy weights, have two spotters working with you.

Breathing. DO IT. Don't hold your breath when lifting weights. Inhale when lowering weights, exhale when raising.

Too Much Protein. A balanced, sensible diet is best. The importance of protein is often inflated.

Adding excess body weight. Don't increase caloric intake just because you're weight training. Increase in muscle mass comes only through high intensity training.

Poor Attitude. Give your workouts a worthwhile direction. Unrealistic goals only set the arena for failure.

COURTS-MARTIAL



OFF-LIMITS

The commanding general, Marine Corps Base, has designated the following establishments as off-limits to military personnel:

1. Adult World Video Theater
2. Friend's Lounge
3. Man's World Movie Mates (including outcall service)
4. Dottie's Movie Mates (formerly Tiger's Eye)
5. 17 South Movie Mates
6. Golden Nugget Movie Mates (formerly Soft Touch Video Mates, Touch Movie Mates and Rainbow)
7. Adult Book Store at 428 Wilmington Highway (doing business as Rat's Store)
8. The Show Place
9. Misty Blue (also known as Mike's Movie Mates, Touch of Class)
10. Bailey's Body Works
11. The Playpen

In addition to the above, appropriate action will be taken to place limits specific activities of organizations which advocate discriminatory practices, to include the facilities and places in which meetings, rallies, and other organizations which espouse or attempt to create discrimination, including but not limited to discrimination based on race, creed, color, sex, or national origin are held.

Entering an off-limits business is a violation of a Base general order. The maximum penalty at a court-martial includes a dishonorable discharge and confinement for two years.
